




Fig. 1 - Typical Forward Current vs. Forward Voltage




Fig. 3 - Typical Reverse Current vs. Junction Temperature




Fig. 2 - Typical Reverse Leakage Current vs. Reverse Voltage






Fig. 4 - Typical Capacitance vs. Reverse Voltage
