


# Optocoupler, Phototransistor Output, High Temperature, 110 °C, Rated



#### **DESCRIPTION**

The TCET1110, TCET1110G consists of a phototransistor optically coupled to a gallium arsenide infrared-emitting diode in a 4 pin plastic dual inline package.

#### **APPLICATIONS**

Circuits for safe protective separation against electrical shock according to safety class II (reinforced isolation):

- $\bullet$  for appl. class I to IV at mains voltage  $\leq 300~V$
- for appl. class I to III at mains voltage ≤ 600 V according to DIN EN 60747-5-2 (VDE 0884), suitable for:
- Switch-mode power supplies
- Line receiver
- Computer peripheral interface
- Microprocessor system interface

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




Fig. 1 - Derating Diagram




Fig. 2 - Test Pulse Diagram for Sample Test according to DIN EN 60747-5-2 (VDE 0884)/IEC 60747-5-5




Fig. 3 - Test Circuit, Non-Saturated Operation




Fig. 4 - Test Circuit, Saturated Operation






Fig. 5 - Switching Times




Fig. 6 - Total Power Dissipation vs. Ambient Temperature




Fig. 7 - Forward Current vs. Forward Voltage




Fig. 8 - Relative Current Transfer Ratio vs.
Ambient Temperature





Fig. 9 - Collector Dark Current vs. Ambient Temperature








Fig. 10 - Collector Current vs. Forward Current




Fig. 11 - Collector Current vs. Collector Emitter Voltage




Fig. 12 - Collector Emitter Saturation Voltage vs. Collector Current




Fig. 13 - Current Transfer Ratio vs. Forward Current




Fig. 14 - Turn-on/off Time vs. Collector Current






Fig. 15 - Turn-on/off Time vs. Forward Current
